14th Michigan Regimental Flag Status Update It has been 2 years now since we started the project to re-create a 14th Michigan Regimental Flag. And we still do not have a flag. Initially we had hoped to have the flag done before Gettysburg Remembrance LAST YEAR. There have been several hurdles and issues concerning the reproduction of the flag. Key among those is the lack of an adequate image in a suitable high enough resolution to create the flag using and kind of current technology. When we requested a high resolution image, (which most people don't understand) the one supplied would barely be adequate for an 8 inch by 11 inch print. The high resolution image requires a 5 foot by 5 foot image sized in gigabytes. The Company that we have been working with is very interested in our project and has been eager to find a solution because there are many people who have been requesting larger size reproduction flags and this is a business the vendor would like be able to provide as part of their services. Civil War Synergies

Some of you may remember that in 2014 as a Civil War Sesquicentennial project, I (Paul) wrote and published a book titled: <u>I Rode With Custer</u> which was based primarily on the Diary and Service of Major Charles Safford, 5th Michigan Cavalry. Further it was dedicated to Solomon Stegris Co. C, 5th Michigan Cavalry. Solomon was Len "Irish"s ancestor. He was 22 years old when he enlisted and he unfortunately never returned home and his gravesite is unknown. I consider Irish to be a close and personal friend. The bonds of brotherhood sometime manifest themselves in many and unusual ways. I recently learned that I too have an ancestor in the 5th Michigan Cavalry (Custer's Michigan Cavalry Brigade.) He is James Shaver. He enlisted at age 18 in Company C, 5th Michigan Cavalry and transferred to Company I, 7th Michigan Cavalry. He survived the war and mustered out at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas on December 15, 1865.



the plan is to create a combination of applicas, stitched lettering and hand painted details especially for the eagle and its feathers. The flag will actually be two flags, a front and a back sewn together. In the next few days I will get back with the Bay Supply owner and finalize a commitment to proceed or end our effort with them. I will take a 3x5 foot flag (shown below) which I had made and painted for the USS Michigan Marine Guard to show them what can be done. If we can use some applicas for lettering and the banner, I will paint the eagle and (maybe) other graphics like below. In the 1860's they usually painted the flags anyway.
