Camp happenings:

Proposed amendments to our Camp Bylaws that mirror the National Organization's adoption of a Junior Associate class of membership as well as correct a few typographical errors in the original document were introduced at the January induction meeting. This would allow those who are ages six to fourteen without a direct lineage from a Union Civil War Veteran to join and become active in our mission. These amendments will be brought to the floor and voted upon at the March Camp meeting on March 17.

Also at the initiation, Brother Chuck made the announcement that he is throwing his hat into the ring for Department of Michigan Commander. This is both a huge honor for Chuck, and for Camp 135. I propose that our camp strongly consider adopting a resolution of support for his candidature at the March meeting.

The Oaklawn Cemetery cannon restoration project in Sturgis is moving ahead. The monument has been registered with the National Organization, which gives us the opportunity to apply for grants if needed. The committee created to

investigate the project met with Mr. Lyman Brown who has been actively trying to get the monument remounted over the last several years. He has fabricated mounting hardware that has been both hardened and powder coated. It was the consensus of the committee to proceed with his offer of the hardware, and a plan that would restore the monument to its original appearance mounted at ground level. This will be discussed further at the March meeting of the Camp.

January Initiation Meeting:

Our elected officers were inducted into their respective offices on January 20, 2009 at our annual dinner with our own Brother Chuck officiating in his capacity as Sr. Vice-Commander of the Dept. of Michigan. We are looking forward to a productive year with remounting the cannon at Oaklawn Cemetery moving right along and a similar project in Niles possibly on the horizon. More will be known and shared on this new project at our March membership meeting.
